Our statement in support of Urkaine

Faculty teaching Russian language, culture, and history at the College of Wooster, as well as their allies in German Studies, unequivocally condemn the Russian invasion of Ukraine. As teachers who have family, friends, and professional connections in Russia, Ukraine, Germany, and the U.S., we are appalled by the unprovoked violence and by distortions of the conflict in the Russian media and are deeply concerned for all those who are subject to the violence in the region. We grieve for the victims of the ongoing attacks and stand with all those in Ukraine, Russia, and beyond who oppose this war.

As events continue to unfold, we continue our commitment to teach and hold events about the languages, complex history, and cultures of Russia and Eastern Europe.
