

Research Question

Is Taiwan's strategy of public diplomacy effective in changing foreign perceptions?

Why?

- Public diplomacy is an emerging field which needs more study

- To preserve its sovereignty, Taiwan has been innovating its diplomatic efforts

- Taiwan's complex diplomatic situation creates a unique environment in which to study public diplomacy's effectiveness

Hypothesis

Taiwan's strategy of public diplomacy will be effective in changing foreign perceptions in the intended direction, especially with the cooperation of non-state actors.

INFORMATIVE INTERVIEW IN TAIPEI

- I traveled to Taipei in May to interview an official at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to inform the survey design

- Specializing in public diplomacy, she provided information about Taiwan's contextual situation and diplomatic strategy

EXPERIMENTAL SURVEY

- Measures the effectiveness of public diplomacy in changing foreign perceptions in the intended direction, conducted via MTurk and Qualtrics

- Sample: Those residing in the USA or US citizens

- Included control questions, a word association exercise, and a feeling thermometer between the People's Republic of China and the United States




INTERVIEW RESULTS

- Taiwan does engage in public diplomacy as part of its diplomatic strategy

- They believe in the power of culture and ideas (cuisine, democracy, etc.)

- The future situation is bright, as is the outlook for US-Taiwan relations





STATISTICAL ANALYSIS

- No significance was detected via the difference of means t-tests

- However, those exposed to state-produced stimuli rated higher on the feeling thermometer than the other two groups

- Word association responses also had no significant variation as seen via the word clouds

Conclusions

- This project did not support my initial hypothesis

- However, evidence showed that there was a pre-existing positive perception of Taiwan in the sample
