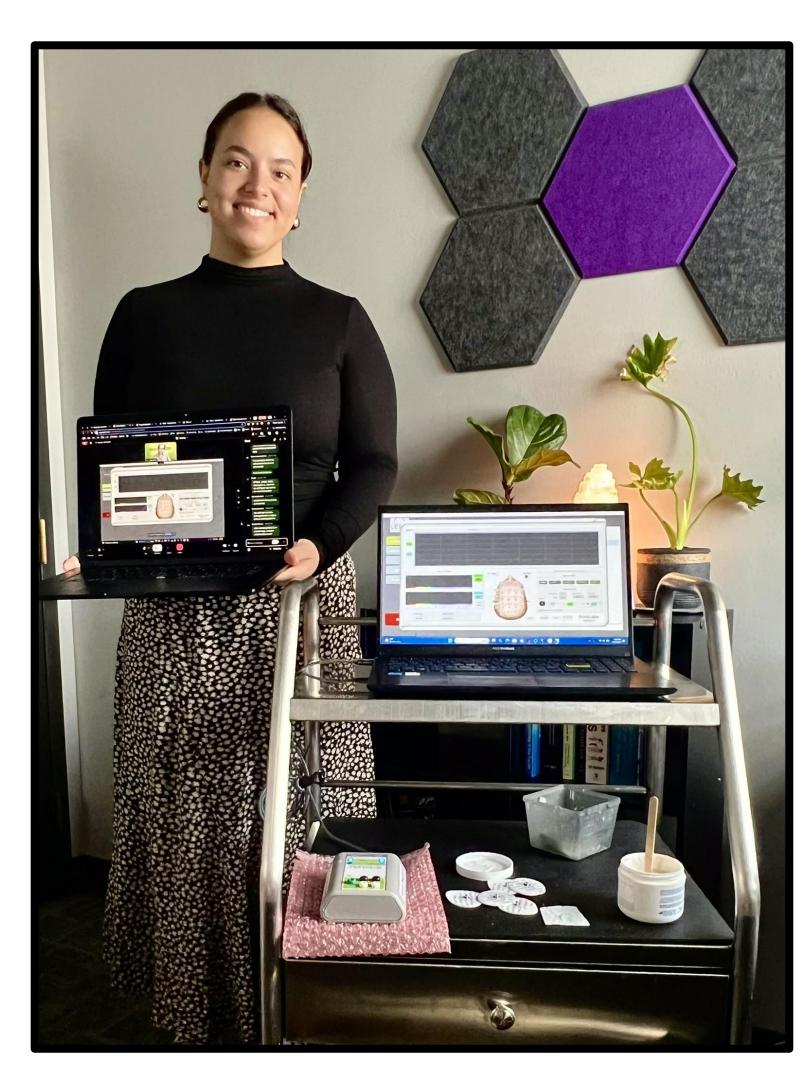

# OVERVIEW OF ALTERNATIVE THERAPEUTICS

Alternative Therapeutics is a mental health clinic in Cuyahoga Falls. Their organization specializes in counseling and neurofeedback, with an emphasis on "alternative" methods to addressing mental health with a trauma-informed focus. They offer services like (LENS) Neurofeedback/Biofeedback, brain mapping, EMDR therapy, and traditional cognitive behavioral talk therapy.



#### **EXPERIENCE**

I got the opportunity to observe the Low Energy Neurofeedback System (LENS) Training hosted by Ochs Labs. I also conducted my own research by gathering client neurofeedback data from the clinicians and completing analysis from pre-, peri-, and post-treatment. Additionally, I facilitated the Race for Wellness, a philanthropic, virtual race effort with the goal of raising money for their Train Your Brain Scholarship. Finally, I completed administrative tasks and ran their social media pages on Instagram and Facebook for promotional and educational purposes.
