

OVERVIEW OF THE PARK ADOPTION COMMUNITY CENTER

The Park is a non-profit organization that provides post-adoption support programs for adoptees and their families. While located in Centennial, CO, they run both national and internationalreaching programs. These programs encourage community engagement, youth empowerment, identity affirmation, and cultural competency.



EXPERIENCE

I served as an adoption research intern. This meant that I collected information through online resources and interviews to create easily digestible material. For example, I provided the information to create a timeline of the history of The Park and its parent organization, CCAI. This helps answer the questions that families often have.

I also completed a research project that focused on adoptees' thoughts about their adoption. Using adoptee art pieces to prompt conversation, I interviewed adoptees and organized their responses to use as future references.



PURPOSE

As an adoption research intern, my main goal was to improve my research and interview skills. I also wanted to gain more experience with working in an office setting. And an adoptee who was already passionate about post-adoption work, I found a strong sense of purpose through this internship.
